# Greetings Saints of God,

Fall is upon us, with the rains coming. I am fickle, and I can go from one day thinking, "It is SOOOO hot! Please bring some rain, God!" And the rain comes (it would have come whether I called for it or not). I find myself yelling, "It is so wet and cold! Can't I get some heat down here?" And God shakes God's head.

That pretty much sums up my relationship with God: God shakes God's head at my actions, reactions, and inactions.

Notice what I don't say: God shakes God's finger at me!

Our God is a God of Grace and love. Our God is a God of holy nudging. Moving us into the right direction, and loving us all the way there. God isn't a God of shame, but a God of Grace. God isn't a God of hate, but a God of love.

October is a good time to remember this, as it is the time that we remember and celebrate the Reformation. Martin Luther, in 1517, helped reclaim and start a movement that highlighted the God of ours that loves us and showers Grace upon us.

Back to showers! Rain showers pouring from the heavens. And this can be frustration, cold, and can get my underwear all in a bunch! Or... Rather... Perhaps... I can look at the rain a different way.

Taking a prompt from Luther, I can choose to use the rain as a reminder of my baptism. I can use the water that pours over my head, whether that be a shower (warm) or the rain (cold), to (re)claim the gift of God's (Amazing) Grace.

On Reformation Sunday, October 29th, we will be celebrating the gift of Baptism, as Elyjah and Maddie affirm their baptism. Many times, we use the phrase, "Are Confirmed..." but it is so much more than that. In a confirmation gathering, it seems as if we are saying, "Yes," to these two young adults. But this is not the case.

When Elyjah and Maddie affirm their baptism, this is a time that they say, "Yes," to a God that has said, "Yes" to them so long ago. That "Yes," that they utter doesn't change whether God loves them or not (Hint: Nothing Separates). But that, "Yes," is a way to say, "I want to continue in this faith, this community, and this journey."

It is a journey. This isn't the end, and all the answers have been secured, and all questioning put away. That isn't how it works. We are all on a lifelong journey of faith, and we walk together. In Baptism, God claims us as God's Children. In affirming their baptism, these two young adults say, "I would like continue the journey, walking with these people of God!"

I am thankful for the voices that these Young Adults bring to the conversation. Our task, as a community, is to take them seriously, and listen with open hearts and open ears. For they are not the Church of the Future. They are the Church of the Here and Now!!

**John Core's Funeral:** September 16th, at St. Andrew's Lutheran in Beaverton, I attended John Core's funeral, husband of Pastor Christine Core. Bishop Laurie presided, and Pastor Scott preached. It was a powerful and moving service.

**Pastor Emillie Binja:** Sunday, September 17th, at 2:00 p.m., many pastors gathered to celebrate the installation of Creator Lutheran's new pastor, Emillie Binja. We give thanks for her ministry, and her presence at Creator.

Children In Worship Creative Cohort: I have been asked by 1517 Media (formerly known as Augsburg Fortress), the publishing ministry of the ELCA, to attend a creative "think tank" (my words). **Devotions:** October's devotions were led by Eileen about encouraging others in community.

**Secretary's Report:** Minutes were approved with one correction. The newsletter deadline was changed from August 17 to August 24.

**Financial Report:** Our expenses exceeded our income for the month of August, but overall for the year to date, our income has exceeded our expenses.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor's advent devotion book, "Grace In the Manger: An Advent Devotional" is now available through Amazon both in book format and Kindle. It will also be available in the main office in late November for \$5. The entire Pastor's report is reported in the newsletter.

### **Old Business:**

Zion's constitution has been updated and sent to the synod for approval. After their review, we have received notice to update or clarify a few areas of the constitution and resubmit to the synod. The congregation will be given the information and vote for approval at the annual meeting in January, 2024.

The new in-house church directory is completed and will be handed out on Sunday, September 24 and will be available in the church office. A special thanks to our photographers, Sandi Nolte and Melissa Anderson, and to LaVonne for putting it all together. Thanks to Pam Bloom for handling the printing.

The "Annex" (room behind the organ) is completed as an addition for altar guild supplies such as church wall hangings and storing the new artificial 12 foot Christmas tree. Thanks to B and B for the new carpet squares laid and the freshly painted walls. Thanks also to Eileen and Mary Dowen for cleaning and organizing the 2 rooms for usage.

## **New Business**

A 4 -5 shelf bookcase is needed in the Annex to store some music books used by organists and pianists. If anyone has a bookcase to donate, contact the church office or Eileen.

A new computer is needed in the main office. The old computer which is over 11 years old is no longer able to run updated programs and software needed to operate our daily business efficiently. A new financial program is needed which requires a new updated computer. A motion was made to purchase a new computer for the office to bring us up to the 21st century and purchase it with memorial funds not to exceed \$1500. Council approved the motion.

Love Inc. has asked to use the Wuest Fellowship room once a month for a class instead of Kraxberger Hall. Council approved the change.

A Beaverton church has offered a quilt to Zion to use either as a hanging or use as a future auction item to raise money for Maui. Deb and Diane will discuss and report back next month.
