ELCA presiding bishop issues statement on Israel-Hamas war

Dear church,

As Lutherans, we are accustomed to holding tension between two truths. Thus the ELCA denounces the egregious acts of Hamas, acts that have led to unspeakable loss of life and hope. At the same time the ELCA denounces the indiscriminate retaliation of Israel against the Palestinian people, both Christian and Muslim.

For the past week we have borne witness to the horrors of the escalating crisis between Israel and Hamas. We also watch a growing humanitarian crisis in Gaza as Israel blocks food, water, fuel and medical supplies and as airstrikes continue to cause unbearable civilian casualties ahead of a just-announced ground assault. We see Israelis and families around the world in the agonizing wait for word about the fate of loved ones killed or taken hostage by Hamas. We are in anguish, grieving and praying for all people who are living in trauma, fear and uncertainty.

Among us are Palestinian Lutherans who are fearful for their families, their communities and their homeland. In our communities we have Jewish and Muslim neighbors, who are also facing the horrors of this crisis and its impact on their loved ones.


It is difficult to find words that suffice in the complexity of this moment, and in the web of relationships that bind us together, as church, with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land and our interreligious partners. Yet God has called us to be a people who stand with others amid suffering.

We must also call a thing a thing. The power exerted against all Palestinian people — through the occupation, the expansion of settlements and the escalating violence — must be called out as a root cause of what we are witnessing. We are committed to our long-standing accompaniment of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land.

The God who liberates us calls us to be a liberating witness. May it be so.

A bookcase was donated for use in the annex room behind the organ.

There are 3 upcoming Christmas piano recitals by various local studios. The dates are 11/2, 12/9, 12/15.

The budget committee will meet for the first time this year on 11/7. The budget will be prepared and presented at the November council meeting. The budget will be presented to the congregation on Sunday, December 3.

Committee Reports:

Worship - the committee will meet in November. Pastor's advent devotional book, Grace In the Manger will be available in the office in late October/early November for \$5.

Service - Egress safety inspection has been completed, sprinklers have been turned off and winterized, new artificial Christmas Tree will be assembled and shaped on October 18.

Learning - Chili Feed and auction is Saturday, October 21 and the Trunk or Treat is Saturday, October 28.

There will be a special coffee hour following Sunday service on October 29 in honor of the confirmands.

Witness - The committee will be meeting to plan 2024's community giving recipients.

Advent by Candlelight will be Saturday night, December 2. Pastor is the "guest" speaker with son Joey providing music.





AMERICAN THANKSGIVING HISTORY

Though the 1621 shindig between the Pilgrims and Native Americans is widely accepted as "the first Thanksgiving," some historians believe that the first American Thanksgiving took place upon Juan Ponce De Leon's landing in Florida in 1513, or Francisco Vásquez de Coronado's service of Thanksgiving in the Texas Panhandle in 1541.

There are also two claims re: Thanksgiving observances taking place in Jamestown, Virginia, in 1607 and 1610.

What most people think of as "the first Thanksgiving"—the famed 1621 meal between the British settlers and the indigenous Wampanoag—was actually a three-day celebration. And while turkey may have been among the many dishes on the menu, it was not the centerpiece of the meal.

The hospitable natives welcomed the English immigrants with venison (five deer in total), corn, and oysters, which were staples of the Wampanoag diet.

America's first President, George Washington, revived the holiday tradition in America by designating special days for a national Thanksgiving.

As Revolutionary War veterans died off, the Thanksgiving tradition was lost in America for a number of years until President Abraham Lincoln declared Thanksgiving a national holiday, to be held the last Thursday in November, in 1863 (during the height of the Civil War).

For almost 80 years Thanksgiving was simply a tradition in the United States. It officially became a national holiday in 1941, when the U.S. Congress passed legislation signed by President Franklin Roosevelt.


