Meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by President Susan.

**Devotions:** Lorilee shared a reading entitled, *Happy Birthday, Jesus*. The gifts we can give to our Lord are obedience, praise, and sacrifice.

**Secretary Report:** November minutes were approved as written.

**Financial/Support:** November's spending exceeded income by almost \$6000. It was noted that we had large expenses due to the main waterline break and repairs. Overall, income exceeds expenses for the year by almost \$5000.

**Pastor's Report:** The entire report is posted in the newsletter.

#### Old Business::

The main waterline has been replaced. The excavator donated his time to make the two day repairs, and B and B coordinated all of the repairs to both piping and sidewalk repairs. We are still waiting for the bill for the concrete repair, but the plumber has been paid. We are very blessed to have this repair done at a low cost thanks to the connections of B and B.

We still need to get the finance office computer up and running and purchase the latest Quickbooks update. A new payroll program is being researched to be used in the future.

The new program for recording financial givings and membership will replace Revelations in the main office starting in January.

The constitution updates will be completed and sent to the ELCA office.

#### **New Business:**

Two piano recitals were held in the sanctuary during the month of December. Both groups were extremely appreciative of our beautiful facility and piano.

Kraxberger Hall had an electrical shortage recently. After an electrical company repaired the shorts in the light fixtures, it was determined that the area needs rewiring to prevent future issues or possible fire. The bid came in at \$3500 to rewire all light fixtures in Kraxberger Hall.

Council voted to proceed with the repairs and cover the expenses using Memorial Funds.

It was suggested that while doing these repairs dimmer switches should be added.

The annual meeting will be January 28, 2024 after the service and then followed by a council meeting. The meeting is a week later than usual because Pastor will be attending a youth extravaganza on Sunday the 21st.

#### **Committee Reports:**

**Worship:** There are two services on Sunday, December 24. The 10 am service is the 4th Sunday in Advent, and the evening is the Christmas Eve Service.

Sunday, December 31 will be a Lessons and Carols service led by Pastor Nolte while Pastor is on a family vacation.

**Service:** The elevator maintenance has been completed. Furnaces have been maintained and filters cleaned and replaced.

The balcony attic has been fogged for insects.

The light fixture outside of the elevator on the main floor needs to be replaced and/or repaired.

**Learning:** The Christmas Program was held on December 17.

Flights will be purchased in January for the National Youth Gathering in July. Five students and two adults will be attending.

**Witness:** The sanctuary was decorated with the new Tree, wreath and window decor. Thanks to all who helped beautifully decorate the sanctuary. Decorations and tree will stay up through Epiphany Sunday.

Newsletter deadline is Thursday, December 21.

**Good of the Order:** *Fill a Stocking* was part of *God's Work, Our Hands* in September. 2145 filled stockings were delivered to families recently and Zion was part of this mission.

A large thank you to the congregation for their response of gifts for Foster's Kids. The presents were a blessing both to the children receiving them as well as the case workers delivering the gifts.

A special thank you to Lis Horton, Gudrun Hartfeil, and Susan Lamb who are leaving council after serving 3 full 2 year terms. They have provided faithful service for six years!

Meeting adjourned at 6:45 pm and followed by The Lord's Prayer.



## Oregon Synod Lay School of Theology presents the Winter 2024 Course, "Wrestling with God: Encountering the Divine in the Hebrew Scriptures"

Eight Thursdays, January 4-February 22, 2024, 6:30-8:00pm on Zoom

Join us for an eight-week course digging into the Hebrew Scriptures! We'll explore names and images for God, including female imagery for the Divine, and offer ways to use this imagery in your spiritual practice. Like Jacob wrestling with the Divine, we'll wrestle with texts. How do we make sense of difficult stories- God's anger that leads to violence? Genocide in Joshua? How does God make Godself known in the natural world, in events, through other nations? What wisdom can we wrestle from these texts to help us live more faithfully? What might we learn, and what might we need to unlearn?

As always, this course will provide opportunities for relationship-building, critical thinking and spiritual practice.

Presenters are Sister India Jensen Kerr (St. Andrew Lutheran, Beaverton), Pr. Jesse Christopherson (Milwaukie Lutheran) and Pr. Emerson Remy Remmers (Grace, Corvallis). Pastor John Reutter-Harrah is the host.






