Greetings Saints of God,

By the time this newsletter arrives in your box, we will have entered into the season of Lent. We will have gone through Holy Hilarity of Shrove Tuesday, and been marked with the sign of the ashen cross, hearing the words, "From dust you came; to dust you shall return." We will close the lid on the box that hides the A_____, and we wait expectantly.

What does that phrase, "we wait expectantly," actually mean? Another way we say it is we wait actively. While God is acting and on the move, and we wait and watch, God also asks that as we wait we do so in movement and with intentionality. It is the gift of Lent. We slow down, and we take notice of that which is around us.

This Lenten season, if you have not done so already, I am asking you to pick up something. We normally think about Lent as a time to give something up. While you might still decide to do this, I would ask that you think about taking up a practice. What do I mean by this?

Here are some practices that you might pick up for Lent, and after 40 days, you might just continue them as a personal spiritual practice:

Pick up the Spiritual Act of Kindness

- Return a shopping cart that wasn't yours.
- Pick up a second food item for HOPE.
- Pick up the art of positive affirmation (for you and a stranger).
- Compliment one person a day.
- Pick up the art of curiosity, asking, "I wonder..." in a positive way.

That is just a short beginning of a list. So many more are waiting for you to discover and to put into practice. I would love to hear about what ones you decide to do! Thank you for all that you do and all that you are to this world!

Pastor John's Report - February 20th, 2023

Worship: We held a Worship Committee, and have scheduled the next one for March 1st. Lots of discussion, and that can be found in the worship report. Couple of highlights: Acolyte Training will be held on March 4th, in the morning. Readers will also be reading parts of the Prayers of Intercession. Lent is starting, and we are sharing an order of palms with Zoar Lutheran.

Lutherwood Sunday: Our Community Giving partner for April is Lutherwood. The last Sunday of April (the 30th), Lutherwood will be present at church, and helping with worship, and bringing greetings from camp.

Communion Wine: My short lived idea of using the Concord Grape Juice for communion was ... short lived. We used to be able to get smaller jars, but we can now only get the larger ones. So, in hopes of reducing waste, I suggested Concord grape juice (available in smaller containers). Ultimately, that led to confusion (and anxiety) whether what we were getting (kids and those of us who don't drink) actual grape juice. So, back to the white grape juice.

Installation of New Members: We installed 7 new members, and 2 have joined as well, but were not able to be at worship that day. So, 9 in total.

Communion Class: We held a communion class on February 4th, and it was very well attended. Along with the teaching, we made a lot of communion bread, and will be using it for the coming months.

Lutheranism 101: Our morning Lutheranism 101 class has come to an end, though I will be holding another one after Easter. Time to be determined.

Bible Study: During the season of Lent, we will be having Bible Study during our Lenten Wednesday gatherings. We have done this before, called, "Wondering and Wandering through Scripture." Wednesday Noon gathers will be with First Baptist, and we will take turns hosting, with the first one (March 1st) to be held at Zion. Soup and Bread will be served.

Continuing Education: January 23-25th, I was in Seaside at the Byberg Preaching Conference. It was a fantastic event and Rev. Traci Blackmon, the keynote speaker and preacher, was amazing. The worship, conversation with friends, and the teaching, all made this a great three day event.

Susi Holecz: Attended a small gathering for Susi's birthday. I was honored to be invited. Fun gathering.10@10: We continue to hold 10@10 Monday through Thursday.

Vesper at Mary's Woods: February 19th, I lead and preached at vespers for the ecumenical vesper service at Mary's Woods Community.

Congregational Deaths: We have had two deaths in the congregation these last two months: Catherine Davidson, and Thea Bialas. Catherine's service is planned for March 25th, and Thea's service is still being scheduled. Funeral: February 25th at 11:00 will be Lyle Howard Warnke's funeral. Lyle used to be a member at Zion in the 1980's, and the family asked if they could have the service here at Zion. I said yes, of course, and we will have service in the sanctuary but no luncheon afterwards.

Personal: Our dog, Sunny, is not doing well. Prayers please.

Meeting was called to order at 5:56 pm

Devotions: Pastor read from his devotional book, "Because Grace, A Lenten Devotional."

Minutes from January were approved as written.

Financial Report: Thanks to faithful giving our income exceeded expenses for the month of January by \$4,577. Concern was raised about the high heating and electricity bills. These items continue to be over budget. Eileen will discuss thermostat settings at the next Maintenance meeting on Monday, February 20.

Pastor's Report: A Pastor from Lutherwood will assist in the service with Pastor on April 30. First Baptist and Zion will partner for the noon Lenten Service alternating the location. Pastor's full report is printed in the newsletter.

Old Business: Deb presented her findings on Emergency Preparedness. It was decided a congregational committee needs to be formed with Deb's guidance to look at essential procedures in case of any type of emergency at the church.

Eileen reported that Zion has an earthquake insurance policy in case of such a disaster. The church is insured for \$4,275,000 with a 10% deductible in case of an earthquake. The Maintenance committee will discuss an emergency gas shut off valve at their next meeting.

Lorilee will research the cost of buying an artificial Christmas Tree for the sanctuary.

New Business: Council will be installed on Sunday, March 5 during service.

God's Work, Our Hands Sunday is September 10, 2023 and will be the 10 year anniversary of this event. The witness committee will research and plan this event.

Saturday, March 11, "LOVE ONE" will have a presentation at First Baptist Church on how to love your neighbor. This is one of the groups we give to for our community giving. All are welcome to attend to learn more about this ministry.

Committee Reports:

Worship - The liturgy will change during lent. Acolyte training will be on March 4. Several students have expressed interest in this ministry. The wearing of robes was discussed. Unfortunately, the acolyte robes are too large for most of the children.

Service - Monthly Egress reports and inspections are done. Toilet flaps have been changed in handicap bathroom. The railing on the south side of the building has been repaired.

We will start getting more bids for the roof.

Learning - Youth and advisors met on January 22 for a planning session. Ideas that were presented were: June carwash, July barbecue, November Harvest Festival, Summer Parking Lot sale. Next meeting will be March 5.

The pie sale was a success selling 48 pies. The youth made \$590.

Witness - The committee recommended an amendment to to funeral/memorial policy manual. To be inserted under the section of Cost/Fees: "This committee and the use of Kraxberger Hall serves those who have an affiliation with Zion Lutheran Church only."

Pastor will still be available for memorials and funerals in the sanctuary for others at his discretion.

Council voted and passed this policy change.






