Greetings, Saints of God!

Minutes from the March meeting were approved as written.

Financial Report: Total income for the month of March was \$19,882 and expenses for the month were \$19,340. Thank you to the congregation for their faithful giving.

Deb Bartel has volunteered to serve on the Servant Committee - council approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor emphasized how well attended the services of Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Service were. The entire report is in the newsletter.

Old Business: Lorilee is waiting on samples of materials that artificial Christmas trees are made of. The committee of Gudrun, Susan Lamb, and Lorilee will make a suggestion to council when information is gathered.

Deb Bartel continues to brainstorm ideas for the roof fundraising project. Susan Arterberry has submitted an application for funds through a program of ABC.

The Constitution of the Church has been updated by Susan A. and Eileen and has been sent to the Synod for approval. It will be presented to council and the congregation for approval in the future.

Karl Gustafson will be having knee surgery on May 12. Cards are encouraged and would be greatly appreciated. Peggy Patterson will cover on May 14, and Chris and Sandi Nolte will cover on May 21 and 28.

Lorilee and Eileen have registered with the Synod and will be attending the Annual Synod Conference on May 20 with Pastor via Zoom.

New Business: There will be a coffee hour on Sunday, April 23 following service. Council will provide refreshments. Lutherwood representatives will participate in the service and answer questions during coffee hour.

There was discussion about resuming weekly coffee hour after Sunday service. It was decided to wait until the Fall to decide.

Service - The courtyard windows will be repaired and caulked when the weather is warmer. The annual fire inspection has been completed.

Learning: The youth helped with the egghunt on Palm Sunday. Thirteen children hunted for eggs. A Game Night is planned on May 7 for 1 - 12th graders.

Witness - A luncheon for Catherine Davidson was held after her memorial. This committee will meet to discuss plans for *God's Work*, *Our Hands* Sunday in September.

Good of the Order: A member of the congregation expressed how special it was to "worship together" with his brother for the first time in a long time on Easter Sunday thanks to streaming! One brother sat in the church balcony while the other watched from New York.

Visiting shut ins and delivering Easter lilies was a blessing for both the recipients and the members who delivered the flowers.

A special thank you to Prince of Life choir and congregation for participating in the joint Good Friday service. There were eighty four in attendance.

A special thank you to Pastor for visiting patients and their families during very difficult times.

Climate Change can be confusing!


