Text Study: We continue to hold Text Study online, via Zoom.

Lunch with the Baptist: Pastor John Withum and I have a standing lunch engagement on Thursdays at 12:30. This has been a wonderful support and deepening friendship.

Bible Study: We have been holding Bible Study online, on Wednesdays. Starting in the fall, we will be having two bible studies. One online, and then an added Bible Study that will be held on Tuesdays at 11:00 a.m. at church.

Youth Extravaganza: As mentioned last month, I was asked to apply to lead a workshop at the Youth Extravaganza, in New Orleans in January 2024. I did, and found out that I was accepted. It will be a 75 minute workshop on Children Sermon prep from beginning to the end, working through two different texts. I also get to do a second workshop... from my hotel room. That is for those who are streaming the event. I will use continuing education funds to pay for the trip.

Advent Devotional: I have started to write a devotional for use during Advent. The title will be, "Grace in the Manager."

Zion Lutheran Council Minutes June 20, 2023

Meeting called to order at 6:00 pm

Devotions: Pastor read a reading from the Gospel in Miniature about breathing spaces. Space allows for the inspiration of the Holy Spirit to work within us. We all need a little space. Some names were duplicated when reporting attendance in last months meeting. The minutes were corrected from the May meeting and approved.

Financial Report: Due to faithful giving for January - May, our income of \$102,881.94 exceeds our year to date expenses of \$93,738.85. The concern is the Service budget has spent \$10,578 over budget mainly due to increases in utilities fees and usages. NW Natural has had a 19% rate increase since November and PGE a 8.68% rate increase. Water and sewer had a rate increase of 3%. All three areas have also seen a large usage increase. Eileen will talk to maintenance committee to look at possible toilet leakage throughout the buildings and discuss power usage.

Pastor's Report: Pastor had several individual meetings with newer members about the life of Zion. The remainder of the report is in the newsletter.

Old Business: Witness is working on God's Work, Our Hands for September and will meet with Pastor in the near future.

The Emergency Preparedness committee consisting of Bill Heerdt, Lori Fawcett, and Deb Bartel met. They will do a presentation for the congregation of preparing a 3 day survival kit for homes in case of an emergency. A handout will be prepared to help members make their kits based on their personal needs.

Bill Heerdt will do a presentation on Climate Change Simulation on an upcoming Saturday. Pastor will set up a date with Bill.

Synod Assembly was held via zoom in May. Lorilee Cronn, Eileen Wiedrich, and Pastor were the representatives who attended. The focus was on the theme of Christian Friendships. In order to save congregation money, Synod Assemblies will only be held in person every three years.

Pastor will follow up on our edited constitution that was sent to the synod.

New Business:

A new church directory has been updated with new members phone numbers and addresses. Council is exploring the idea of creating a new photo directory in house. Instead of hiring a photo company we would ask members with high quality cameras to take the pictures. It was decided a committee will be formed to coordinate this project.

Committee Reports:

Worship: Karl is back and making good progress after surgery. The committee will meet in July to start Fall planning.

Service: The monthly required Egress has been completed inspecting all safety and exit lights. Several tables in Kraxberger Hall have been repaired.

The caulking of the Sunday School building windows facing the courtyard has been completed. The courtyard narthex door and the outside door in Pastor's office have been repaired after a report that they were sticking and not closing tight.

The cabinets in the women's restroom in Kraxberger Hall have been completed and installed. Thanks again to Pam Bloom for this donation.

Learning Committee: The car wash on June 4 raised \$600 for the national Youth Gathering and Extravaganza. It was noted that money collected throughout the years from youth fundraising activities is to support ongoing events in the future as well as current activities.

A bulletin board has been put up in parking lot narthex to display youth pictures and upcoming events.

Confirmation camp - Pastor and three youth are attending the last week of June.

Next youth event is July 15. The youth are hosting a Saturday barbecue and games for the congregation. A free will offering will be collected for the youth fund.

Witness: Aunt Dee's service and reception was held on June 4.

To help Gudrun and Susan, a Hospitality committee is now in place to help with the work of putting on these receptions. A big thank you to all who have committed to helping with these receptions and being the "arms and legs" for Gudrun and Susan!

ZLCW met Saturday, June 17 for a brainstorming session. Seventeen women were in attendance and are planning their purpose statement and prepare events and activities.



Dinorah will be greatly missed by all who knew and loved her.



Gelebration Dessert

Patriotic Jello Poke Cake

Indredients:

- White Cake Mix
- Blue jello
- Red jello
- Water
- Whipped topping
- Sprinkles



Bake cake according to box directions. Bake and cool. Prepare jello: combine a 1/2 cup boiling water with blue jello in a bowl. Stir until it is dissolved. Do the same for the red jello.

Using a wooden spoon handle, poke holes in the cake (about 1 1/2 inch apart). Carefully spoon jello mixtures into the holes, trying to only pour one color into each hole. Alo be sure to spread the colors throughout to create a fun color pattern.

While the jello soaks into the cake, place in the refrigerator for 30, minutes.

When ready to serve—frost with whipped topping and sprinkles!


