Greetings Saints of God,

We are in the midst of putting together a new directory with pictures and everything! Fancy! And it is needed, as there have been many changes over the years since we last put one together. By the time this newsletter comes out, we might actually have it done, or pretty darn close. The picture directory is not specifically a “member” directory, but rather one that covers members and friends of Zion. And that fact alone leads me to the topic of this newsletter article.

The question has been asked: “How do I know if I am a member?”

In “olden” days, there was much more of a firm understanding of who was a member, what was a member and how you became a member. For some, the change from that is frustrating, and others, who fall into the “I won’t join any organization that would have me as a member” (Groucho Marx) don’t really notice. It is a quandary.

Do you need to be a member of Zion? No. You are a child of God, and wrapped in the loving Grace of Jesus. Period.

But if you are wondering, “Am I a member of Zion?” And, another question, “Why would I want to be a member?” Well, surprise... I have some thoughts.

Let’s answer the second question first. This is my standard answer: “It is good for the life of the congregation.” When the congregation sees people stand up front and say, “I want to officially be part of this congregation,” it is good. Very good. The longer answer is that knowing our official membership roles helps us determine future plans. There are particular aspects of the church that one needs to be an official member to take part in, due to the constitution. Serving on Council or the Call Committee (which is the committee that interviews people for the position of Pastor) requires you to be an official member.

So, how do you become a member? By letting me know!! Are you a member? If you don’t know, there is a good chance that we should make this relationship official. About twice a year, we have an “installation of new members,” where you, along with others joining, stand in front of the congregation in worship and make promises. It is a renewal and remembrance of baptism. The entire congregation, like at your baptism, makes promises back to you.

To help prepare for that day, we will have a New Member/Lutheranism 101 class starting up in late September, which is a great place to start. You can learn more about Zion, the history of the congregation, the essence of Lutheranism, and meet other people. This class isn’t solely for New Members, but it is a great place to learn, grow and take part at Zion.

If you have been a member of another Lutheran Congregation (as well as some other denominations), you can have us request a letter of transfer, and your membership there will be transferred to Zion. This helps the clergy and congregation that you were a member, know that your spiritual care is being taken care of elsewhere. This helps them as well!

I am very happy to talk with you more about membership, life of Zion, and the mission we share as the body of Christ. Please don’t hesitate to ask, and over a cup of coffee we can chat!

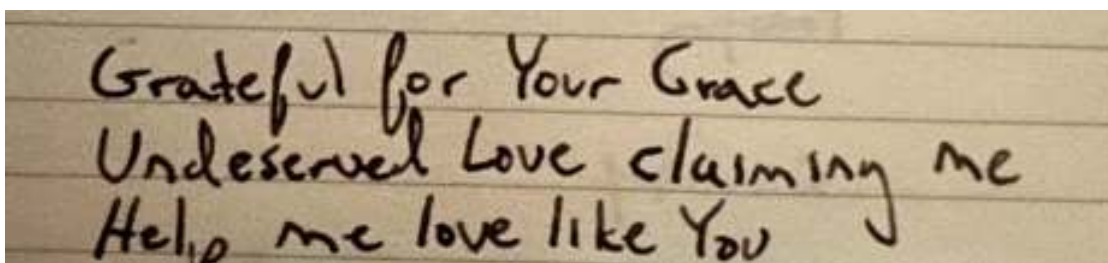

Devotions: Pastor would like council members to take turns leading devotions starting next month. Eileen will lead devotions in September. Pastor read from, “Meditations That Make You Smile.” How does God know our name? God sees our every move and knows our needs.

Secretary’s Report: July minutes are approved as written.

Financial Report: Our income exceeded our expenses for the month of July and year to date. Our congregation continues to be faithful givers. A report of our investments at Edward Jones was presented by Eileen. All accounts have shown positive growth year to date.

Pastor’s Report: The full report is in the newsletter.

Old Business:

God’s Work, Our Hands weekend is September 8/9/10. The witness committee has planned several events for the congregation to participate in.

1. On Friday, September 8, from 1 pm to 3 pm, Zion is asked to participate with the project, “Fill a Stocking”. All supplies are included. All that is needed is hands to fill the stockings. The location is across from Bugatti’s in Oregon City.
2. On Saturday, September 9, from 9 am to 1 pm, members can participate at the Hope Pantry at the Baptist church.
3. Also on September 9, from 9 am to 1 pm, one can participate in a Neighborhood Clean up. Gloves, garbage bags and grabbers will be supplied.
4. On September 9, from 9 am to 1 pm, in Kraxberger Hall members can sit with their coffee to write personal thank yous to fire department personnel in Canby and Oregon City. Nancy Hargitt will supply note cards.
5. At 1pm on Saturday on September 9, Bill Heerdt will present a hour long Climate change simulation with time for questions after.

The new in-house photo church directory will be done by mid September. Photos will be taken before and after church for 3 Sundays by two members of Zion.

A 12’ artificial Christmas Tree has been purchased for the sanctuary. Two members have paid for the tree.

New Business:

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to repurpose the room behind the organ to accommodate the church paraments and other worship material. The maintenance committee will discuss what needs to be done during their September meeting.

Climate Resilience and Disaster Preparedness -Julie Weinand, an intern with Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon has reached out to Zion for a discussion about faith communities, climate resilience, and disaster preparedness. Deb Bartel will talk with Bill Heerdt about a possible meeting.

Lorilee and Jeff Cronn are willing to work with Auction House to help raise money for the roof fund. Zion members can donate items for auction and the Cronns would follow through with the collection process. It was decided that January and February next year would be a good time to start this project. More information will follow.

Committee Reports:

Worship: A list of screening suggestions for the Sunday streamers has been typed for them to follow. The idea is to make streaming more uniform regardless of who is operating the computer on a particular Sunday.

Service: Monthly safety EGRESS was completed as per requirements. A new light weight vacuum cleaner has been purchased by a member for cleaning pews and in between pews in the sanctuary. All the toilets in the church has been tested by Jeff Cronn. One was found to have a leak and will be addressed at next maintenance meeting.

Sprinkler heads were repaired/replaced and adjusted by John Wicklund.

Learning: A meeting will be scheduled before the end of the month. Youth involvement in God's Work, Our Hands will be discussed. Sunday, Sept 10 is Rally Day - Sunday School will have activities and resume on that day.

Witness: God's Work, Our Hands and the purchase of a Christmas Tree have been discussed above.

Other: Newsletter deadline is Thursday, September 21st.

Good of the Order:

Eileen gave thanks to our members and expressed the importance in the healing process by the many prayers, texts, and calls she received. Lorilee also thanked the congregation for the support after the loss of her sister-in-law. Both expressed how caring our Zion family is in times of healing and crisis.

Meeting adjourned and followed with The Lord's Prayer at 7:11pm.

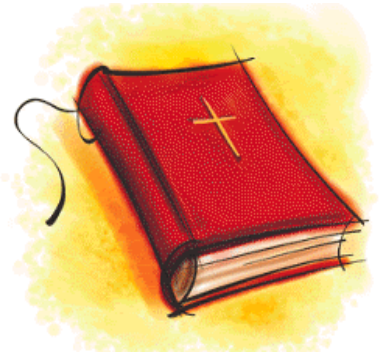

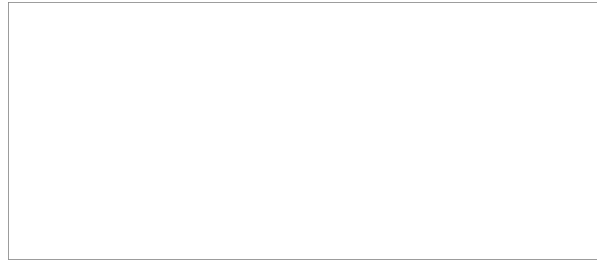
